

This \$122 million, design-build project will provide final design and construction of the transfer level expansion and redevelopment of the Main Terminal and Airsides A, C, E and F.


The 50,000-SF transfer level expansion includes additions to the east and west plaza decks of the Main Terminal building; the relocation of the shuttle car lobbies for Airsides A, C, E and F; and the removal of the former Airside D shuttle lobby. These additions and modifications would help TPA achieve their 20 year facility requirement.

The redevelopment program also includes 200,000-SF of renovations to the Main Terminal and all four Airside buildings. These improvements include ticket and baggage claim wayfinding signage and seating improvements, airport concession redevelopment and airside functional improvements.





### Prequalification Process

All subcontractors, interested in working with Skanska, must complete the Skanska Prequalification process application. This is a prerequisite in order to business with us. To start the process, follow these steps:

- 2. Complete the short Prequal inquiry questionnaire and click on "Submit".
- 3. You will receive a unique user name and password within 2 (two) business days. You'll receive this information via email with a link to the actual Prequalification process website.
- 4. Complete your Prequalification application online.
- 5. Once you have been approved as a prequalified subcontractor, you will have access to our secure Subcontractor Portal. This resource allows you to look at the same drawings our preconstruction teams are reviewing and to find out how to contact the correct estimator who can answer any specific project-related questions.
